Commandment III

Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slaves, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the Lord has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy. Ex: 20: 8-11

Later on the Lord elaborated on this, in Ex: 31: 12-17: "You must also tell the Israelites: Take care to keep my sabbaths, for that is to be the token between you and me throughout the generations, to show that is I, the Lord, who make you holy. Therefore, you must keep the sabbath as something sacred..."

"Anyone who does work on the sabbath day shall be put to death. So shall the Israelites observe the sabbath, keeping it throughout their generations as a perpetual covenant. Between me and the Israelites it is to be an everlasting token for in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, but on the seventh day he rested at his ease."

It is obvious from the above that keeping the sabbath is very important to the Lord. And we have the words of Jesus, in Matthew 5: 17-18, saying: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets. I have come, not to abolish them, but to fulfill them. Of this much I assure you:


Social Ministry Group Sponsors Videos on Catholic Church





Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It was in 1898 that a great institution known as St. Monica Church began its work of building God's Kingdom on Genesee Street.

It was 1962 - 1965 that this great institution known as St. Monica began to "be Church" in a different way due to the Second Vatican Council.



1898-1998

It was in 1974 that Fr. Avery Dulles, S.J. wrote his ground breaking classic book known as "Models of the Church" in which he articulated the differing ways the Church does the work of Christ.

As I very briefly define these "models," see where you might place your emphasis in terms of your past experiences of the Church and in terms of your present and future expectations of Church.

The Institutional Model of Church emphasizes the hierarchical and organizational structure of the Church. The Church as Mystical Communion Model stresses the role of the Holy Spirit in the spiritual, sociological and psychological aspects of our common life together. Hospitality is very important.

When we view Church in the Sacramental Model, it is that visible life of grace imparted through the Sacraments which binds us in our liturgical life. Fr. Dulles also referred to the Church as the Herald Model, the evangelizer and proclaimer of God is "Good News."

September 17, 1898. The Spanish-American War was under way. You could travel from Rochester to Niagara Falls or Buffalo and back for .75¢. This was the same price dentists at the time were charging for teeth cleaning. A tailored man's suit would set you back \$20, and women's shoes were about \$3.00. If you purchased the Post Express newspaper that day, you would have paid .02¢ and you would have read about events surrounding the laying of St. Monica's cornerstone.

Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid joined Rev. John P. Brophy, St. Monica's first pastor, and parishioners to dedicate the church. It was the diocese's 17th Catholic church in the city.

In addition to the now yellowed copy of the Post Express, other 100-year-old items discovered just a few weeks ago when parishioners re-opened a small copper box that had been placed in the cornerstone back in 1898 included:

- · A Holy Bible
- · A photo of Rev. John P. Brophy
- · A pink ribbon featuring a line drawing of the church
- A copy of the Catholic Journal also covering the cornerstone event
- · A copy of an "Encyclical Letter of Our Holy Father by Divine Providence Pope Leo XIII on The Condition of Labor'
- · A copy of the "Annual Collection for the Ecclesiastical Students of the Diocese of Rochester for 1897."
