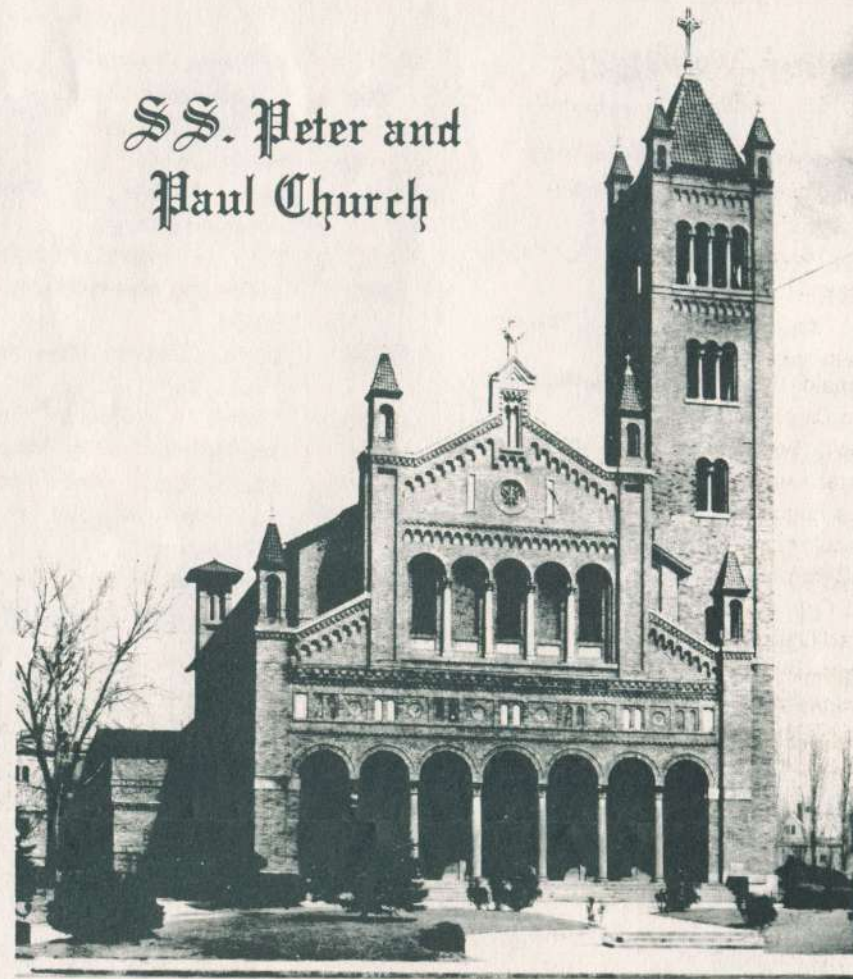

GOOD CHURCH SINGING IS REALLY POSSIBLE

It is all a matter of attitude. Once we realize the full meaning of the Mass and the miracle it represents and the hope this miracle offers our human search for peace and fulfillment then the development of a positive attitude is a simple matter ... then lively singing in church is a cinch.

In the Eucharistic celebration we express our belief that God is truly present in his only Son's body and blood which is changed from the bread and wine by the ordained power of the priest. Our belief in celebrating this miracle indicates our faith in our spiritual immortality.

When we realize the importance of this most meaningful celebration, then singing is a natural response. We know we are effectively praying for our eternal happiness through our adoration, thanksgiving and prayer at the Mass.

Take the advice of a great church writer: "Sing all. See that you join with the

congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a slight degree of weariness or weakness hinder you. Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, nor more ashamed of its being heard, than when you sing the songs of Satan!"

Sing with gusto for the greater honor and glory of God, your own welfare and that of your neighbor. It will pay you rich dividends in personal satisfaction, increased devotion and a deeper appreciation and love for God.

You "gotta wanna" sing. Then you will find church singing a breeze.
