

# Solemn Organ Dedication

---

This instrument, majestic in appearance and beautiful in design, is very complete in the number and selection of its stops and its mechanical equipment. The action throughout is tubular-pneumatic. The console, a splendid piece of workmanship, is detached from the organ. The power is furnished by an electric motor. The tone, the main quality in an organ, is characteristic in each stop, from the delicacy of the *Æolian* to the majestic tone of the Trombone, and the overpowering effect of the full organ.

The Latin inscription on the organ taken from Psalm 150 in its English version, reads :

**"Praise ye the Lord with sound of trumpets,  
praise Him with strings and organs,  
Let every spirit praise the Lord."**

On the two tablets on the organ-front are recorded the names of all the stops contained in the organ, and also the names of the generous donors.
