The RCIA, Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a process by which men and women become full members of a Catholic community of faith.



- --baptized Catholics who want to prepare for First Eucharist and/or Confirmation

FAST AND ABSTINENCE:

- 1. All Catholics 14 years and older must <u>abstain</u> from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
- 2. All Catholics who are at least 18 years old but not yet 59 may take only one full meal (<u>fast</u>) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Two smaller meals are permitted <u>only</u> if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- 3. Personal disciplines of fasting not eating between meals for example or of abstaining refraining from eating favorite or luxurious foods is encouraged during Lent.
