PRAYER: The time of Lent is a time to renew our prayer life. Pope Paul recently lamented the absence of prayer. "No one wants to pray anymore," he said. "But Christian life without prayer is like a burned-out candle". Men, women and children are the only creatures on earth who can lift their thoughts to the Source of their lives and give Him their love. The first three of the ten commandments - love for God - are invitations to pray: to keep some time in our lives free to enter into friendly conversation with God. Jesus is God speaking to us. Jesus Himself is present in The Eucharist - God speaking to us through Him and we speaking to God in return through Jesus. This is the greatest prayer: the Mass.

In the Mass, the believing community together with Jesus and in His Spirit, speaks to God and each to his neighbor in words of love. When we break our daily routine and lift our minds and hearts to God in the Eucharist, we find our hearts with our neighbor, our relatives and friends. Private prayer is offered in silence when we "pray to our Father who sees in secret." God first speaks to us and we answer Him. The model for all our prayers is the one taught by Jesus, "The Lord's Prayer".

"Pray always", says St. Paul. Even the meanest of our duties can be a prayer when offered as an act of love to God. Especially when our duties involve us in helping others. Get into the habit of living prayerfully.

Because we were made one with Jesus in our baptism, we are faced this week with our duty to follow Him in His mission to transform the world in the face of all the obstacles placed in the way by the powers of darkness. May the palm you take home with you today remind you that your victory is obtainable only with Christ, in Christ and through Christ.

DAILY MASSES, MONDAY - TUESDAY - WEDNESDAY: 11:20 - 12:10 & 5:30.

HOLY THURSDAY = EVENING MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER = 7:30 P.M.

The Church will remain open after this Mass until Midnight for holy hours of adoration. There will be no adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from Midnight, throughout Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

GOOD FRIDAY = CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION = 3:00 P. M.

Good Friday is a day of fast (one full meal) and abstinence (no meat) as a sign of sorrow for our part in bringing suffering and death to Jesus.

HOLY SATURDAY = A day of quiet reflection on the events of Good Friday.

Confessions: 4 - 5 P.M. - EASTER VIGIL: 7:30 P.M.

NOTE WELL: There will be no 5:30 P.M. mass this Saturday. We do not begin to anticipate celebration of Easter before 7:00 P. M.

"Peace" = the gift of God to people through Jesus Christ. Jesus calls it
"His" Peace that He gives, "My own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give,
this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." (Jo 14:27)
What is it that Jesus has that is "peace", which no one else has? Some people
think of "peace" as the absence of trouble, and run away from responsibilities "to
have some peace." But Jesus "set His face like flint" and faced the Cross, accept-
ing it. He overcame by taking up His Cross. His peace is the result. What is it?
It is that serenity and freedom from fear which comes from a loving union with the
Father, and this is what Jesus has left us - the way to that peace through abid-
ing faith in Him.

Thursday of this week, April 24th is the Feast of St. Mark, the author
of one of the gospels. Mark was a disciple of St. Peter. He wrote his account
of the "good news" of salvation after Peter's death (A.D. 64) and it is commonly
believed that he wrote this gospel between 65 and 70 A.D. The gospel of Mark is
regarded as the oldest of our gospels. Mark (also called John Mark) was the son
of a lady, whose house was a meeting place of the early church (Acts 12:12). He
was a companion of Paul and Barnabas for a while, but apparently was frightened
of the dangers, and went back home. However, he shows up later as a companion
of Paul in prison (Colossians 4:10), and when Paul was nearing his execution,
he asked Timothy to bring Mark - "I find him a useful helper in my work." St.
Mark tells the story of Jesus simply, lovingly and vividly. It is the closest
thing we have to a biography of Jesus.
