Third Sunday of the Year

"Jonah" this is the name given to a book of the bible included among the prophets. The leading character in this short story is named Jonah and given the role of a prophet. He is what we would call today an anti-hero because although the only Hebrew in the tale, he is the least likeable of all the characters. This is a story to teach a lesson and the lesson is that while God may threaten severe punishment He is always ready to pardon at the first sign of sorrow for sin. Jonah was a racist. He did not want to preach repentance to non-jews. He ran away from the call of God which only showed his foolishness. The Forgiveness gave a lesson of humility and repentance to the Chosen People of God.

Did a whale actually swallow Jonah and spit him out three days later? Remember this is not history and does not pretend to be something which took place in reality. Jesus will use the conversion of the people of Nineveh as an example of true penance and forgiveness. He also used Jonah in the great fish as a sign of his burial and resurrection.

We have noticed that when the children make their weekly offerings at the 12 O'clock Mass, they express their thanks to God for their life. We wonder if they sense an anti-life atmosphere in the world around them and if so whether they are telling us something precious. One of the Psalms praises God that "out of the mouths of babes and sucklings you have perfected praise". Today is the anniversary of the decision of our Supreme Court legalizing abortion. These old men and some university professors would do well to listen to our little people.

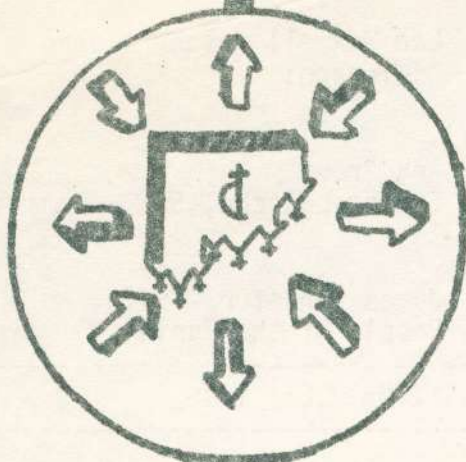

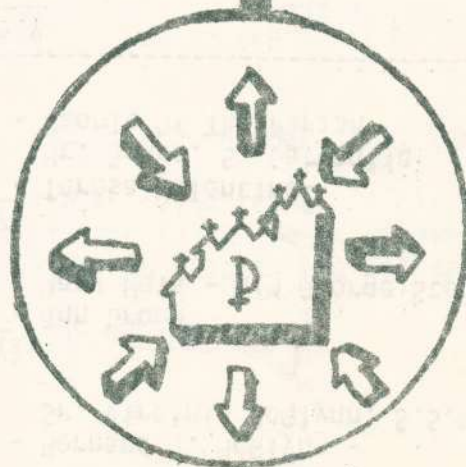

EIGHTH ORDINARY SUNDAY

As the days begin to lengthen we move into that season of the Church Year called Lent, a word derived from our old English word meaning "Spring". Lent is a period of fasting and penance in preparation for the celebration of Easter. We live in time and there is a time for feasting and a time for fasting, a time for pleasure and a time for self-denial. One form for self-denial is to put a strict limit on the amount of food we eat, and this is called "fasting". Another form of self-denial is to abstain from meat. So, days of fasting have but one full meal and days of abstinence are without meat in any form. We begin lent on Wednesday - a day of fasting and abstinence. Every Friday in lent is a meatless day.

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday. We will bless and impose ashes on our heads during the Mass. (At 11:20 AM and 5:30 PM). This will be a public acceptance of our need to turn away from sin and accept the way of life taught by Jesus.

During the six weeks of lent we will imitate Jesus who fasted and prayed for forty days to prepare for His mission; we will prepare ourselves to renew the consecration we made to God in Christ when we were baptized. In the Masses of lent we will not shout or sing "Alleluia" until the gospel story of the first Easter at the Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday.

The parish family will gather in the school hall after the 5:30 PM Mass on Wednesday to share our traditional "Stone Soup" made from contributions to the soup pot brought from home.

Friday of this week is the First Friday of the month dedicated to a return of personal love to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Mass and Communion is in order for this day.

Next Sunday there will be a special collection for the "Black and Native American" ministry.

Many of our Christian heroes and heroines are martyrs. A martyr is a person who dies, shedding his blood for Jesus Christ. The word martyr means "a witness". On the feast days of martyrs we wear red vestments as a sign of the kind of witness these men and women performed.

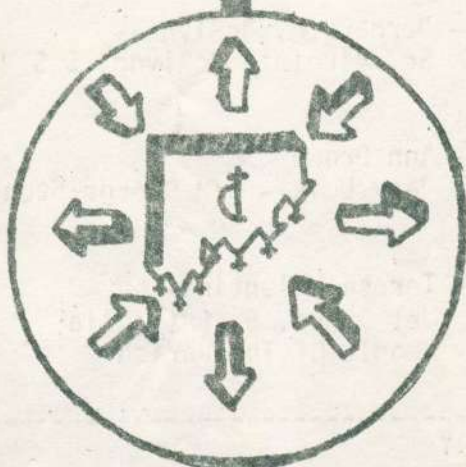

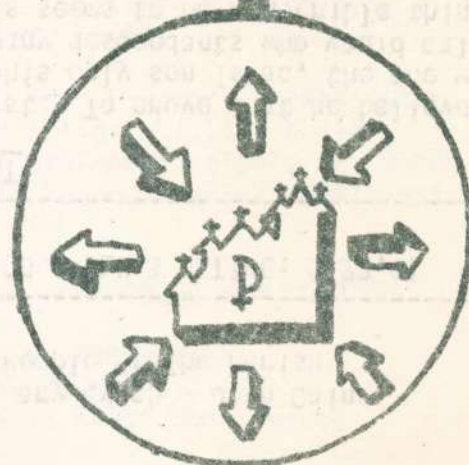

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

"God put Abraham to the test". It was a fearful test. To prove that he believed all that God promised, Abraham is asked to destroy his only son Isaac, the one who was given Abraham as a pledge that there would be many descendants who would call Abraham their ancestor. From our point of view this seems to be a horrible thing for God to do to Abraham - to ask that someone who had already shown his faith and obedience to go to such an extreme as to kill every chance of achieving what was promised in the first place. What we should remember however, is that the faith of Abraham was to be the most important of any human acceptance of God's word. If Abraham had not given himself over so completely to the will of God, the development of faith in the Saving God by those who came after him would hardly have been possible. More was demanded of Abraham because he was the foundation of faith for the rest of salvation history. We call him "our father in the faith" somewhat as we call George Washington the Father of our country. Both had to sacrifice much for their faith - the one in God, the other in the future of the republic. When we are troubled and tempted to leave off having any trust in God we can look back to the experience of Abraham and once more pick up our burdens confident that God will bless us abundantly.

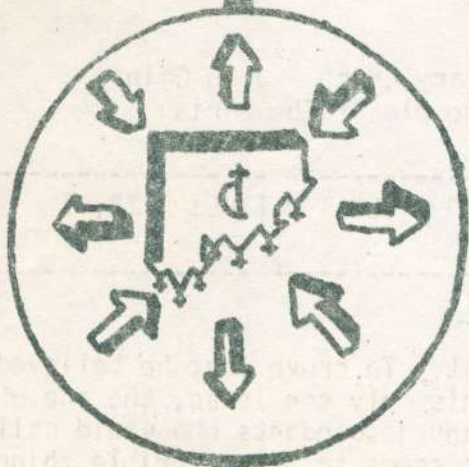

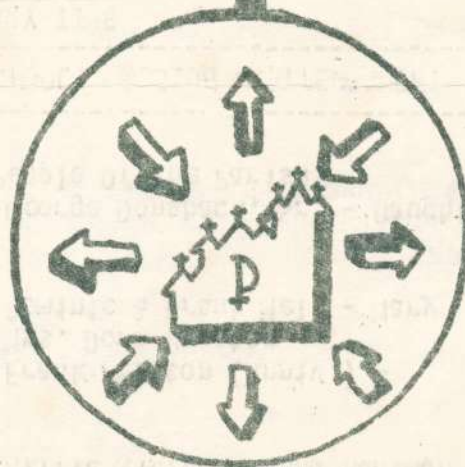

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Wednesday of this week is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. It is a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION when Catholics are expected to gather at the celebration of Mass to praise and thank God for the glories He has bestowed on the Mother of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. The Masses for the Holy Day will be at 11:20 and 5:30 PM.

The Church from its earliest years showed a faith that, Upon her death, Mary was taken bodily into Heaven. In 1950, responding to the agreement and requests of the Bishops from all over the world, Pope Pius XII declared and defined it to be a divinely revealed doctrine that: "The Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever Virgin, was, at the end of her earthly life, assumed body and soul into heavenly glory".

Jesus says in today's Gospel: "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him". This means two things: Faith is a gift from God and people can reject this grace, even as they did in the presence of Jesus. St. Paul tells us that it is God's will that all be saved. When the Bible uses the word "draw" it implies a certain kind of resistance. The fisherman "draws" the fish to his net or his line but the fish fight against his lures. Faith is a free act both as a gift of God and as an acceptance of God on the part of the people. No one is to be forced to accept Christ, otherwise there would be no love, and love is the fruit of genuine faith. We are all called to be children of God through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus: this is the "lure", the "drawing". But for faith to be reasonable and free no one should have his arm twisted. This is the meaning of religious freedom. Rather than force people to accept His truth, Jesus willingly accepted death and his death is a demonstration of the greatest love.

In the gospels of Matthew and Mark there is mention of the "brothers and sisters" of Jesus. Against this is the constant faith of the Church in the perpetual virginity of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. The term "brother" (and "sister") has a broader meaning in the scriptures than children of the same parents. The words can include close relatives, cousins, nephews, nieces, etc. In the New Testament Christians are called brothers and sisters about 160 times. Jesus Himself said "Whoever does the will of my heavenly Father is brother, sister and mother to me". In the narrow sense of brother and sister we believe that Mary had no other child than Jesus and so he had no brothers and sisters.

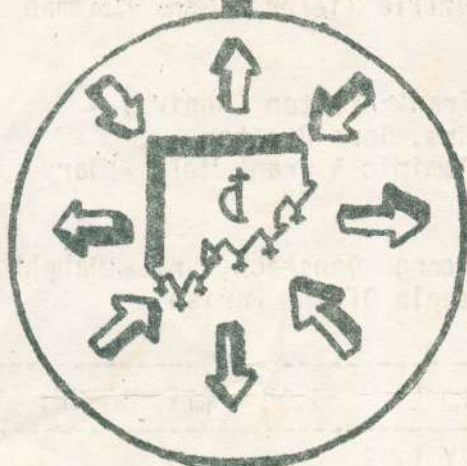
