Excerpts from information provided September 2004 (DOR Office of Pastoral Planning) to representatives from each of the parishes/faith communities in our planning group.

Diocesan Overview: 12 Counties 7,500 square miles area

151 parishes ... 119,000 registered households ... 380,000 Catholics

126 non-retired diocesan priests (11 order priests & 19 externs in Diocesan assignments)

Only 57% of parishes are traditional stand-alone parishes.

- Assumptions for Projections of Number of Priests (Center for Applied Research on the Apostolate at Georgetown University
 - a) **retirement** stays at age 70. and b) 15 ordinations every **ten** years (historic rate). -there is some service after retirement age.
 - In the United States there is 1.3 priest(s) for every one thousand Catholics.

Policies (DOR):

- No priest will say more than 3 Masses of Sunday Obligation including Saturday evening Mass.
- Every parish must have a weekly Sunday Eucharist as long as this is possible and practical.
- <u>No</u> pastor, priest administrator, or pastoral administrator will be assigned to <u>more than three</u> <u>parishes</u> or be responsible for <u>more than three Sunday worship sites</u>.
- a cluster of two or three parishes with a single pastor is <u>not</u> the norm under canon law. <u>Any cluster should be moving toward becoming a single canonical parish.</u>
