ST. PETERS CHURCH.—The protracted trials growing out of the late dispute among the members of St. Peters Church, for possession, were brought to a close at the Police Office yesterday. Justice Moore convicted seven of the Anti-Bishop party who attempted to enter the Church, and imposed a nominal fine of \$2,50 each. It is understood that the matter will be carried up on *certiorari*; when the question of right of possession, with which the Police Justice has nothing to do, will be tried.
